## **Professional Development:**

Overview of assessment and evaluation policy. A document is available on line. An overview of the fundamental components of the policy. Brochure handed out. How to support student learning and what is the difference between assessment and evaluation.

A 2 page handout, outlines basic principles of assessment and evaluation. It is included in the student agenda. Something new this year, minimum report card mark, the ministry policy says the minimum grade will be 35%, even if the student hands in nothing. The comments will reflect that the student has not earned the grade but it is a minimum. There is now a board wide policy on late assignments.

Lorie Brown: Concerns with the consistency of the truancy policy that the teachers abide by. Her son misses school a lot and there doesn't seem to be any discipline. She also called and left messages to try to find out directly from the teachers and didn't receive a call back from any of the 2 teachers she called.
